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

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
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## WELCOME TO SAN DIEGO'S BEAUTIFUL BALBOA PARK!

Where culture, science, and nature collide, Balboa Park is home to more than 16 museums, multiple performing arts venues, lovely gardens, trails, and many other creative and recreational attractions, including the San Diego Zoo. With a variety of cultural institutions among its 1,200 beautiful and lushly planted acres, there is something for everyone.

### **HISTORY**

The stunning architecture and landscaping in the park are the legacy of two expositions:

The 1915-16 Panama-California Exposition commemorated the opening of the Panama Canal and provided a major incentive for the creation of the park as it appears today. Most of the arts organizations along Balboa Park's famous El Prado pedestrian walkway are housed in Spanish Renaissance-style buildings constructed for the 1915 Exposition.

The 1935-36 California Pacific International **Exposition** was held to boost the local economy during the Depression. Many of the buildings around the Pan American Plaza at the southern end of the park were created for the 1935 Exposition and present a fascinating architectural history of the Southwest.

The 8,500-square-foot home is designed by renowned architects William Hebbard and Irving Gill and includes an impressive collection of art and furnishings of the era.
