One of the most historic and transformative projects we are thrilled to be part of is the ongoing Botanical Building and Gardens Revitalization. With Phase 1, focusing on structural restoration, complete, we've now started on Phase 2. This next phase will not only preserve the building's historic integrity but also enhance the surrounding gardens, improve accessibility, and create new spaces for education and community gatherings. 

DnD BioBlitz Adventure:

MERGING ART, SCIENCE, & FANTASY

On July 26, Zoro Garden in Balboa Park became the gateway to a magical world where art and science collided in celebration of Comic–Con weekend. EcoLogik Institute and Forever Balboa Park, in partnership with Cosplay for Science, IF/THEN, and the Los Angeles Zoo, hosted a DnD–themed BioBlitz that brought together over 300 participants for an unforgettable adventure.

Park visitors were invited to immerse themselves in this free event and engage in a variety of activities that blended creativity with scientific inquiry. From designing their own costumes to exploring the wonders of paleontology through interactive demonstrations and models, attendees were drawn into a vibrant world of discovery.

The heart of the event was the BioBlitz, featuring both main and side quests designed and orchestrated by EcoLogik Institute's Conservation and Environmental Stewardship Apprentices. These young environmental stewards crafted a unique experience that invited participants to explore the park's biodiversity while contributing valuable data to community science.

The **EcoLogik Institute** is a groundbreaking program that connects young women to nature through engaging, hands-on experiences in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. As part of **Forever Balboa Park's commitment to offering free educational programming that inspires environmental stewardship**, EcoLogik empowers participants to become innovators, environmental leaders, and changemakers in their communities, fostering a positive impact on the world around them.

Celebrating 110 Years

As the Botanical Building and Gardens in Balboa Park approaches its **110th anniversary**, a major revitalization effort has reached a key milestone. This project aims to preserve the beauty and historical significance of one of the park's most iconic landmarks while enhancing the visitor experience for generations to come.



PROJECT PROGRESS:

Phase 1 Complete

We are thrilled to announce the completion of Phase 1, a monumental effort achieved through partnerships with the City of San Diego, Spectra Company, EC Contractors, Nan Sterman, Parks and Recreation, and many others. This phase focused on restoring the building's structural integrity and historical features, preparing it for the next chapter in its storied history.





LOOKING AHEAD: Phase 2

Led and funded by Forever Balboa Park, Phase 2 is set to transform the surrounding gardens and improve accessibility throughout the area. Highlights include the reconstruction of the historic pergola, construction of ADA-compliant paths, the restoration of historic fountains, and intricate work on the urns and balustrades, which have been featured in our recent social media updates. These enhancements will ensure that the beauty of the Botanical Building and Gardens is accessible to all visitors while preserving its historic charm.



Revitalization and Stewardship of a Historic Park Garden

THE KATE O. SESSIONS CACTUS GARDEN



The Kate O. Sessions Cactus Garden was developed in 1935 under the direction of its namesake. Today, Forever Balboa Park monitors and cares for this garden, with the help of our volunteers and in partnership with the City of San Diego. Over the years, a tremendous need for improvements in the historic garden has arisen.

The need for revitalizing the cactus garden was heightened in 2022, when an act of vandalism left the garden in a critical state. The main irrigation source was severely damaged, leaving this garden without a water connection source; the walking trails were flooded and ruined; and several plants were stolen or severely damaged.

In the wake of 2022's vandalism, Forever Balboa Park worked with the city and key partners to:

- Repair the flood-damaged walking trails
- Fund installation of a protective cage around the repaired irrigation system
- Deploy volunteer Garden Stewards to salvage and replant several of the damaged cacti

Enriching the Cactus Garden



ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES

Forever Balboa Park staff and summer interns meticulously inventoried the cacti and plant species, compiling in-depth information into an interactive map. Visitors can access the map and learn more about the garden's plants by scanning a QR code in the garden.



STREAMLINED MAINTENANCE SYSTEMS

Before the renovations, the garden could only be watered manually with water-filled buckets. The garden is now equipped with a centrally controlled irrigation system that can be operated with a mobile device, tremendously simplifying routine maintenance.






WORLD DESIGN CAPITAL
